- American Sign Language may be used to fulfill this requirement by transfer credit or by proficiency

- **Completion of third year of** one foreign language in high school or successful completion of the second semester or higher of college-level foreign language with a passing grade or equivalent proficiency as determined by examination
- Students who have successfully completed one semester of college foreign language credit may elect to satisfy this requirement by studying abroad in an approved program in a country whose main language is the same as the one studied in college
- American Sign Language may be used to fulfill this requirement by transfer credit or by proficiency
- **International students from a country where English is not a first language will have this requirement waived**

- **Completion of Level III proficiency** of one foreign language in high school or successful completion of the second semester or higher of college-level foreign language with a passing grade or equivalent proficiency as determined by examination
- Students who have successfully completed one semester of college foreign language credit may elect to satisfy this requirement by studying abroad in an approved program in a country whose main

language is the same as the one studied in college

- American Sign Language may be used to fulfill this requirement by transfer credit or by proficiency
- International students from a country where English is not the primary language and whose first language is not English will have this requirement waived
